

Cal City Area History. . .

Saint Victor Parish was founded on April 19, 1925 to serve a growing population in Calumet City, many of whom worshipped in Hammond, Ind. The homilies would be in English as the new parish served a large population of 2nd generation Polish, and also, Italian, Irish, German, Slavic, and Lithuanians. The first building was wooden and erected at the corner of Price Avenue and Memorial Drive. Fr. William Rooney was the founding pastor.



The school building was completed in 1926. The Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur arrived that summer to staff the school, which opened with 340 pupils. The first floor was a hall and a library on the south end, and a kitchen and dining room for the sisters at the north end. The 2nd floor was six classrooms, a chapel, and the sisters' sleeping quarters. Sister Blandine was the first principal. In 1928, a four-year high school course was inaugurated and the grammar school had 452 students. Mass was celebrated in the new brick church December 23, 1928. The architecture is Romanesque in style and originally sat 729 people.

Weathering the Great Depression, the church continued to grow. A convent was built ca. 1951, a new rectory in 1955, and school wing addition in 1956. In 1959, the interior of the church was remodeled from the Latin form. A Jubilee 2000 fundraiser restored the plaster, new paint, and refinished the original hardwood floors (throwing out the carpeting added from the 1960s), and exists much as we see it today. In 1978, the sanctuary was renovated and sculptor Lillian Brulc designed a new two-piece crucifix—the beautiful bronze crucifix still hangs above the altar.

Many ministries were created to serve the community, such as Jubilee Retreat weekends, Operation Summer for teens, Victor Care, A.A., Al-anon, and a soup kitchen. Since the 1970s thru today, the music ministry has been outstanding.





In the 1990s, the job market, changes in population, and an aging congregation saw a decline, but in the 2000s, new parishioners joined the church with great diversity including Nigerian, Latino, in addition to multi-generation residents. The Hispanic community grew fast and two masses in Spanish were added—one filling the church to capacity that additional pews had to be brought back. In 2016, St. Victor and Our Lady of Knock combined resources and staffing to become a bigger Parish. However, with the current Renew My Church program, an official Decree was issued that starting July 1, 2019, the three parishes of Calumet City

would be extinguished and one new parish would be formed with three worship sites. The name ad interim is *Our Lady of Knock and SS. Andrew and Victor Parish*.


STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

The windows were made by the Tyrolese Art Glass Co., Innsbruck, Austria. Each of the Neo-Romanesque windows feature an oculus.

Above photo. Saint Pope Victor I. Victor, dressed in full papal regalia, stands at a church entrance to proclaim the day of Easter. He is holding the papal crosier and the scroll with medallion. Because of Pope Victor (189-199 A.D.), the date of Easter was set on a Sunday to unify the celebration.

Left photo. Saint Paul & Saint Peter.

Paul, standing with Peter before Christ, is presenting a book of his works to Christ. Peter is kneeling as he receives the crossed keys from Christ. The scene is known as *traditio legis*, or the passing of the law, connecting every Pope since in a unbroken chain.
