The National Park Service in Our Region: Places to Experience Our Cultural History

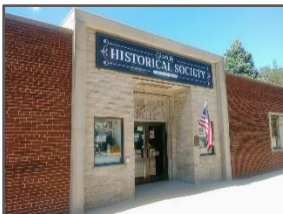
